The Community Café and Bar will be serving a selection of drinks, cakes & scones. The Football Club are playing at home & will provide a BBQ.



Parish Charity News

Covid-19 Re-start Grants

The Yaxham Parish Charity is keen to help village not-for-profit organisations to get back on their feet after the enforced lockdown. The Charity is therefore making small grants of up to £250 available to Yaxham non-commercial organisations to help towards Covid-19 related costs such as sanitiser, gloves, masks, visors etc.

The first grants have now been made to: the YVAA for the Village Hall, The Community Car Scheme, Yaxham Primary School and Yaxham Community Café.

The total budget for the scheme is £2,500. The scheme runs until the next planned Charity meeting on the 24th September. All not-for-profit organisations in Yaxham who serve the community or part of it are eligible to apply. Grants for the Village Hall

Great news that the Village Hall is re-opening after lockdown and a re-decoration. The Parish Charity has made a number of grants to help make this happen, including:

June 2019, £22,280 being half the estimated costs for the Village Hall Refurbishment phase 1 (with a further £13,368 from Breckland Council).

October 2019, £1,000 to help with essential firesafety works for the Village Hall.

April 2020, £5,725 or 60% of the Refurbishment Phase 2 – painting and floors – successfully done during lockdown.

July 2020, £250 as a Covid-19 grant towards the Covid-19 costs of re-opening the Village Hall.

Grants for the Football Club

The reinvigorated Football Club, which now has 3 teams, has been awarded grants for:

June 2020, £600 for new dugouts on the playing field to replace the ones that had fallen into disrepair and have been removed.

October 2019, £865 towards the new goal posts, now installed and treatment of the playing field including "verti-draining" and "over-seeding".

New Litter Bin at Pinns Corner

The current litter bin by the picnic table at Pinns Corner was installed by the Yaxham Woodland Group some years ago.

The bin has been the subject of frequent damage from mindless vandalism. It has needed repeated repair by a local resident – to whom great thanks.

To hopefully address this the Parish Council has purchased a brand new and hopefully more robust litter bin. This is being installed by Parish Councillors led by Cllr Anthony Cheetham. A CCTV sign has been installed by Cllr Chris Couves – thank you both.

Litter Picking

The Parish Council organised a litter pick earlier this year which was a great success, and we had hoped to repeat this exercise every 3 months or so. With the remaining Covid-19 restrictions we cannot at the moment do a formal litter pick.

HOWEVER, all residents who regularly walk in the parish can do their bit by taking a bag with them, say once a week, and collecting up the rubbish on their walk. For bigger rubbish that has been flytipped on the road or the verge then this can be reported via Breckland's website at www.breckland.gov.uk/reportit/ and it should then be collected by Serco – let us know if it isn't yaxhamparishclerk@gmail.com. Here's to when we can get out together again on a litter pick.

Parking on Pavements, Please Don't!

During Lockdown there was a number of instances of parking on pavements. Letters went to some residents asking them not to.

Parking on pavements is inconsiderate, whether all 4 wheels or just 2. It can force people in wheelchairs or with prams or buggies to walk out into the road, putting themselves in danger.

The main roads in Yaxham are wide-enough that you can comfortably park on the road; if you are unable to park on your own property. This has the added advantage of helping to slow the traffic – which is no bad thing.

Whilst it is not illegal to park on pavements in Norfolk, if it obstructs the pavement for other users it is a breach of the Highway Code and then it can be subject to prosecution.

Please be considerate of other residents and park on your own property or fully on the road.

Other News...

- The missing white "H" line has been painted in at the bottom of Well Hill by Highways.
- The overhanging hedges on Mill Lane have been cut back following a letter from the Council to the landowner Glavenhill/ Lanpro.
- The owner of the Old Post Office has tidied the site after a letter from the Parish Council.
- An important drainage ditch on Yaxham Waters was filled in with a small pipe. The County Council acted, at the behest of the Parish Council, and the ditch was cleared.
- ➤ The grass at the bottom of Well Hill has been cut back by Parish Cllr Anthony Cheetham.
- Glavenhill/Lanpro have been asked by the Parish Council, after complaints by neighbouring farmers, to deal with the rampant Wild Oats on their land.
- Overgrown grass on Footpaths 2 (by the school) and CRF 10 (Mouses Lane) will be cut after the crops have been harvested.
- The village gateways will be installed as lockdown restrictions are lifted.
